B. Community Events

Natasha Bissell went over the events that were provided in the report included in the agenda.

Staff Reports:

A. Parks – Ron Taormina, Public Works Superintendent

- Community Garden volunteer clean up event was a success.
- The Campbell Community Center track repairs are needed and the contractor will come out to make the repairs and it should take about 2-3 days. There will be a deep cleaning of the track, then it will be restriped and will look like new.
- Skatepark demolition has been completed by our streets department, and the new equipment will be in on March 9, 2026.
- The air strider that was broken on the track has now been fixed and in use.
- There have been a lot of gang-related graffiti activities at John D Morgan Park in the past weeks, so our staff is trying to stay on top of it.
- Along the Los Gatos Creek Trail south of the pedestrian bridge of the park, there is a 25-foot drop-off that needs to be addressed by Santa Clara Valley Water District. They will remove the vegetation in the creek and work on the slope to build it back up. In the meantime, there will be a temporary asphalt path to divert foot traffic to where it is safer for pedestrians and cyclists.

B. Recreation and Community Services Director – Natasha Bissell

- Fumigation at the Ainsley House was successful, the reinforcement project in the Ainsley House should take place next week.
- Heritage Theatre season of shows still has two more shows in the season.
 - Easton Corbin on Thursday, February 26th at 8pm
 - Natalie MacMaster & Donnell Leahy and the Celtic All-Stars on Saturday, February 28th at 8pm
- The Adult Center will host their annual Lunar New Year event on Friday, February 27th from 5pm-7pm. Tickets go on sale on January 20. Tickets are \$25.
- Pool has reopened after a 65-day closure.
- Skatepark renovation has begun and the previous equipment has been removed from the space. The new equipment is slated for installation on March 9.
- This last Fall the Water Tower Kitchen did a Beer of the Month fundraiser where a portion went to the Recreation Youth Scholarship program and last night Council accepted a donation of \$4,000.
- There will be a study session with City Council on March 3rd in regard to maintenance of City infrastructure and how to address those issues. It is an opportunity for the PRC to provide input if they so desire or to simply watch as it will be live streamed on YouTube.

Good of the Game

Commissioner Teeter has biked the Los Gatos Creek Trail and saw two bald eagles at Vasona Park, it was spectacular to see.

Commissioner Malone mentioned the graffiti and is thankful that it gets taken care of right away. The kiosk at Campbell Park needs an update of the Plexi-glass and pressure washing of the backside of it.

Commissioner Loffer went to Jack Fischer Park and did the story walk and it was a wonderful thing to see.

Commissioner Frederick mentioned how amazing the street trees look.

Chair Lee adjourned the meeting at 7:49 pm.
