1. Roll Call – After Vice-Chair Smith arrived, a quorum was reached. Roll call was taken at approximately 5:32 p.m.	• Noted.

3. East Campbell Avenue Plan Line Study: No update.	• Noted.
4. Receive Committee Staff Report: Staff reported that Vice Chair Smith and staff met at the junction of the Los Gatos Creek Trail and the newly opened Pruneyard Creek Trail to discuss wayfinding signs and chicane spacings. Staff answered questions regarding sign colors. Guide signs are green. Recreational signs are brown. The chicane spacings at the bottom of the hill (northern end) will increase to 12 feet apart (existing is six feet apart). The top of the hill (southern end) chicanes will be removed. The fences are approximately six feet wide.	• Staff to follow up on stencils and wayfinding signs.

The BPAC asked about stenciling the bridges over the Los Gatos Creek Trail or adding a “Campbell Ave” sign facing eastbound trail users to help travelers know their location.

Ongoing Projects Update
Regular BPAC Meeting on March 19, 2026

- **Hamilton Avenue Resurfacing Project:** The City awarded the construction contract to McKim Corporation of Gilroy. Construction is scheduled to begin on March 31 pending McKim’s meeting pre-construction requirements such as submitting approved material submittals and acquiring permits from Caltrans and the Santa Clara County Roads & Airports Department. - **Hamilton Avenue/Highway 17 Bicycle Overcrossing Feasibility Study.** On February 3, 2026, the City Council accepted the final feasibility study. The project webpage is located at <https://www.campbellca.gov/1505/Hamilton-AvenueState-Route-17-Bicycle-Ov->.
- **Multimodal Transportation Plan:** The consultant team is preparing to present preliminary recommendations to the Interagency Coordination Committee (ICC) on March 19 and Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) in April. On April 7, the consultant is scheduled to present to the City Council an update on the project and proposed Phase 2 public outreach efforts.
