NEW BUSINESS

1. **Study Session - Pavement Maintenance Program**

Recommended Action: That the City Council receives a status report on the Pavement Maintenance Program and previews the impacts of various funding strategies on the future condition of the roadway network.

City Engineer Olay presented a staff report dated February 18, 2025. Information was provided related to the Pavement Maintenance Program, the Pavement Condition Index (PCI), preventative pavement maintenance treatments; annual pavement maintenance funding sources and strategies; pavement maintenance budgeting options, and regulations on pavement projects.

The City Council provided feedback on acceptable roadway conditions, available and previous funding sources and allocations, Accessibility ramps and ADA compliance, and vehicle impact fees.

There was a general consensus of the City Council to support looking into vehicle impact fees.
