**NOTICE TO VOTERS**  
**OF ARGUMENT DEADLINES**  
**AND 10-DAY PUBLIC EXAMINATION PERIOD**

The City Council (the "Council") of the City of Campbell (the "City"), acting under the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended (the "Act"), Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing at Section 53311, of the California Government Code (the "Act"), has formed its "City of Campbell Community Facilities District No. 1" (the "CFD") for the purpose of financing certain public services.

In connection with the annexation to the City of a previously-unincorporated pocket of territory known as Cambrian No. 36 and an area currently located in the City of San Jose known as Central Park (the "Annexation Territory"), the City, pursuant to its Resolution No. 11501 adopted on January 15, 2013 (the "Election Resolution"), has called an election of the registered voters in the Annexation Territory, to be held on April 16, 2013, on two propositions (the "Ballot Measures"): (i) the annexation of the Annexation Territory to the CFD and (ii) the levy of special taxes in the Annexation Territory according to the rate and method of apportionment of special tax described in Exhibit A to the Election Resolution (the "Rate and Method").

The Council gives notice as follows:

1. The City Clerk has fixed 5:00 p.m. on January 29, 2013, as the deadline after which no arguments for or against the Ballot Measures may be submitted to the City Clerk. All such arguments must be submitted to the City Clerk at 70 N. First Street, Campbell, California 95008. No argument shall exceed 300 words in length. Each ballot argument submitted to the City Clerk must be accompanied by the printed name and signature of the author or authors submitting it, or, if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. No more than five signatures will be printed with the argument. The City Clerk will cause one argument for and one argument against the Ballot Measures to be printed and mailed with the ballot.

2. The City Clerk has fixed January 30, 2013 through February 8, 2013 as the 10-calendar day examination period required by the Act with respect to the arguments for and against the Ballot Measures. Voters may examine the Ballot Measures, the City Attorney's impartial analysis of the Ballot Measures, the argument for the Ballot Measures and the argument against the Ballot Measures in the office of the City Clerk at 70 N. First Street, Campbell, California 95008, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday during such period.

3. The City Clerk has fixed 5:00 p.m. on February 8, 2013 as the deadline after which no rebuttal arguments may be submitted to the City Clerk. All such rebuttal arguments must be submitted to the City Clerk at 70 N. First Street, Campbell, California 95008. No rebuttal argument shall exceed 250 words in length. The author or a majority of the authors of an argument relating to the Ballot Measures may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument or

may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument. A rebuttal argument may not be signed by more than five persons.

4. The City Clerk has fixed February 9, 2013 through February 18, 2013 as the 10-calendar day examination period required by the Act with respect to any rebuttal arguments. Voters may examine the Ballot Measures, the City Attorney's impartial analysis of the Ballot Measures, the argument for the Ballot Measures, the argument against the Ballot Measures and any rebuttal arguments in the office of the City Clerk at 70 N. First Street, Campbell, California 95008, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday during such period.

5. The City Clerk will mail election materials to the qualified electors on or about April 1, 2013.

6. The election will be a mail-ballot election. All ballots must be submitted to the City Clerk at 70 N. First Street, Campbell, California 95008 in the envelope provided along with the election materials no later than 8:00 p.m. on April 16, 2013.
