Exciting things are happening in Campbell this Fall. The Community Development Department is working to get additional resources online for businesses, residents and developers. Two additional downtown restaurants had the opportunity to apply for funding to support the construction of a parklet. The grant closes at 5pm on August 30th. # Stay In the KNOW:

**City Council adopts updates to the affordable housing impact fee and a new commercial linkage fee.**

Based on the affordable housing nexus study by BAE Urban Economics, City Council approved changes on August 20th to the affordable housing impact fee and a new commercial linkage fee. One of the most significant changes in the new ordinance is housing developments with 5 units or more will now be subject to the affordable housing impact fee. Starting next year all new commercial developments will be subject to a \$9 per foot commercial linkage fee. There are several other changes included in the ordinance which are explained in the City [staff report](#). The purpose of these fees is to promote additional affordable housing units and raise up to \$537,000 per year in funding to support new housing projects and further the goals outlined in the City's 2023-2031 Housing Element.



## Learn More: Solid Waste Compliance

Senate Bill 1383 was put in place in 2016 to divert organic waste from California's landfills. This means all commercial businesses are required to separate organics, recyclables, and landfill by providing the appropriate bins for their employees and customers. To learn more about SB 1383 and ensure your business is in compliance sign up for a free webinar hosted by the Campbell Chamber and City Public Works Department.

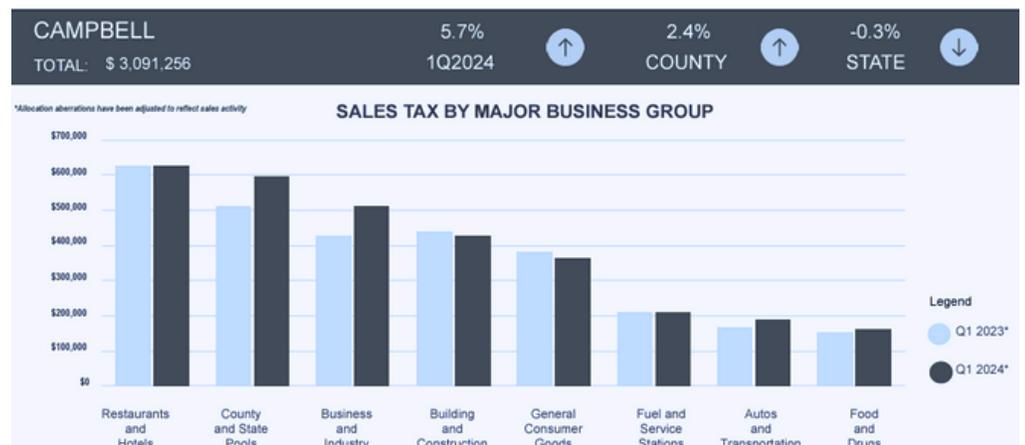
# Spotlight: City Maps Gallery

The City of Campbell's January - March sales tax numbers have just been released by HdL. Sales are up 5.7% compared to the same period from 2023. This is a larger increase than the State sale tax revenue which was down -0.3% and the Bay Area which was down -2.3% overall.
